



With the new year, comes a new Damage Prevention Training Season

In 2014 Call Okie's Damage Prevention Team has teamed up with the Oklahoma Pipeline Awareness Liaison (OPAL) to spread the Damage Prevention message across Oklahoma. Call Okie and OPAL are collaborating together to share venues and audiences with our safety programs. This partnership increases attendance and lowers costs for both organizations. The Call Okie trainings are done in the mornings and OPAL's first responder training is in the afternoon. The attendees of both events share a catered lunch in between meetings.

Another advantage to this collaboration is that the Call Okie stakeholders are able to participate in both the meetings which adds value to each presentation and lets the attendees see the great relationship we have with our stakeholders/members.

April is "Safe Digging" Month!

This April marks the seventh annual National Safe Digging Month, reminding Oklahoma residents to always call 811 or go online and submit a web ticket at least 48 hours before any digging project. Gov. Fallin issued a proclamation announcing April as Safe Digging Month in Oklahoma.

"As April marks the start of spring digging season, we are using this month to strongly encourage individuals and companies to call online or qo www.callokie.com and submit a web ticket before they begin digging. Making this free call helps prevent injuries, property damage and inconvenient outages," said Susan Bohl, Executive Director for Call Okie. "Every six minutes underground utility line is damaged because someone decided to dig without first calling 811."

Striking a single line can cause injury, repair costs, fines and inconvenient outages. Every digging project, no matter how large or small, necessitates a call to 811. Installing a mailbox, putting in a fence, building a deck and laying a patio are all examples of digging projects that need a call to 811 before starting.

1 pkg Oreo Cookies
1- 3.9oz chocolate
instant pudding
2 cups cold milk
8oz Cool Whip
24 gummy worms
8-10 plastic cups (8oz)

- 1. Seal the sandwich cookies in a plastic bag and crush them into tiny pieces.
- 2. Pour the milk into the mixing bowl and add the pudding mix. Beat with the wire whisk until well blended (about two minutes). Let pudding stand for five minutes.
- 3. Stir whipped topping and 1/2 of the crushed cookies into the pudding (very gently). Place about 1 tablespoon of the remaining crushed cookies into the bottom of each cup.
- 4. Fill cups about 3/4 full with pudding mixture. Top each cup with the rest of the crushed cookies. Add gummy worms and insects to decorate. Put cups into the refrigerator for about one hour to chill them-- and enjoy!

April is National Safe Digging Month.

Calling 811 is the only way to learn which utility lines (gas, electric, phone, internet, water and sewer) are buried near your property. The utility operators in your area will mark the lines with paint or flags to help you know where to avoid when you begin your spring digging project.

You don't have to own a backhoe to make a phone call to 811. Small projects such as planting a garden or shrubs, installing a mailbox or putting in a fence should only start once you've made this easy, free phone call. The 811 campaign is promoted nationally by the Common Ground Alliance, the leading association that protects underground utilities and the people who dig near them.
