August 11th is 811 Day!

With Aug. 11 almost here, we hope this date on the calendar, 8/11, will serve as a natural reminder for residents to call 811 prior to any digging project to have underground utility lines marked. This comes on the heels of a recent survey by The National Gardening Association which found that 68 percent of households anticipate their do-it-yourself lawn and garden projects will remain the same in 2009 despite the recession.

When calling 811, homeowners are connected to Call Okie, the local one-call center, which notifies the appropriate utility companies of their intent to dig. Professional locators are then sent to the requested digging site to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags or spray paint.

Additionally, with Aug. 11 falling on a Tuesday, anyone planning to dig on the weekend of Aug. 15-16 should call 811 during the first half of the week. Call Okie requires a call 48-hours before the planned project start date.

Striking a single line can cause injury, repair costs, fines and inconvenient outages. Every digging project, no matter how large or small, warrants a call to 811. Installing a mailbox, putting in a fence, building a deck and laying a patio are all examples of digging projects that need a call to 811 before starting.
